2019/AGM/NOV/07 Address by the College President - highlights

Dr. Yveline Houenou, the College President, welcomed all Members and Fellows to the Annual General meeting. The President's address highlighted the successes and difficulties that the College was facing in the provision of quality medical care through the training and certification of Physicians in the different specialties and the accreditation of suitable hospitals to deliver the training.

She reported that the College had made major progress in establishing international linkages, especially with other Colleges, Francophone Integration, repositioning the College to meet the training and education needs of West African populations to meet their health care needs. Working closely with WAHO to meet the health needs of the sub-region and Faculties organize workshops and symposia throughout the sub-region, as evidenced by the course entitled "Doctors as Educators" and the one on "Resuscitation of the Neonates".

In terms of infrastructure, College has built a building with its own funds and a conference hall that was commissioned during the October 2019 exams in Abuja; it has also initiated the launching of a grant management office.

The College continues to improve on the procedures and processes for organizing examination registrations and online fee payments. The digitization of theses is in progress with a view to establishing open archives, thus making scientific documentation available online; the College is also continuing to strengthen the competence of examiners on an ongoing basis.



2019/AGM/NOV/08 MATTERS ARISING

- a. All approvals have been implemented.
- b. **Accreditation of Training Institutions:** All accreditation reports have been processed and letters of approval issued to concerned training centres.
- c. **Chapter Status:** AGM ratified the granting of Charter to Niger as a Chapter of the College. Representative from Guinea Bissau would be attending the 44th AGSM in Banjul, Gambia in 2020.
- d. Doctor as Educators was held successfully in Sierra Leone.
- e. Cost Cutting Measures: It was implemented as follows:
 - o Faculty Board was held during the 2019 April Examination at Ibadan.
 - Examination Committee and F and PGC were held during the 2019 July Statutory Meetings. Huge money was saved for the College on hotels, feeding and logistics.

2019/AGM/NOV/09 SECRETARY GENERAL'S REPORT - highlights

The Secretary-General, Dr. Albert Akpalu, presented his reports to meeting as follows:

- 1. Abuja building Plot 160, Rachel T. Owolabi Close, Cadastral Zone B13, Gaduwa District.
 - Building main hall is 90% completed, which was used successfully during October 2019 Examinations. Funds are needed to complete outstanding works. A new scope of cost for the Tower has been requested.
 - A serious appeal to Fellows to contribute to the building fund.
 - Work to restart on the tower at negotiated conditions
 - College has secured an extension for payment of deeds of assignment and payment debt of N25 Million to 19th March, 2020.
 - A 3000kva generator has been purchased and is in use
 - Air conditioners and Sanitary wares in place
 - 1000 branded chairs and 250 tables have been procured.
 - 3 Proposals for Facility management are been scrutinized.
 - Additional investment in CCTV /Fire and safety/Public address system and a mobile stage is required
 - Halogen security has been asked to extend their security contract to Abuja



 The College needs to have a staff on ground to keep our presence there and offer liaison services to candidates and Fellows.

2. Appointment of Head of Administration:

 Following a rigorous screening and interview, a new Head of Administration: Mr. Modo Augustine Uzo has been appointed and is to start work on the 1st of December 2019. His experience as an Organizational and human resources specialist fits our need, as WACP to aid in our restructuring process.

3. College Examinations:

- Were successfully held simultaneously in all centres. College has provided brand new state of the art mannequins (Paediatric/Adult) plus accessories for use in the exams as well as two high resolution projectors. Scantron machines are now deployed to the three main exam centres.
- Computer based testing and e-proposals and e -dissertations are in the pipeline for implementation.
- A TOT is planned to address these issues with Chief Examiners and Stakeholders.
- A fair rotation of examiners has been discussed with Chief examiners.
- 4. College History Book: Has been published and will be on sale at this AGSM.

5. Appointments:

- Revamped the Research and Grants Management Office: Dr. B.S.C Uzochukwu of the Faculty of Community Health has been appointed Director.
- Strategic Plan Monitoring: Appointment of Dr. Steve Abah of the Faculty of Community Health as the Evaluator of the Strategic Plan.
- Dr. Victor Ansa of the Faculty of Internal Medicine appointed as the Director of Training and to understudy Dr. S. Kadiri.

6. College Dues:

- College is proposing that Fellows pay their dues directly to College through its
 online portal and remit directly to Chapters. This will improve our revenue
 generation and be extended to Fellows in the Diaspora. College has developed a
 database of fellows since inception in 1976. This is critical to the sustainability of
 the College.
- 7. **Constitution**: Chapters have been asked to collate amendments to the current constitution and present at the next 2020 AGSM.
- 8. **Meeting Schedules**: In line with previous Council/AGM directives, July meetings limited to Finance and General Purpose Committee and Examination Committee. During April Examination: Faculty boards/ Accreditation/Strategic Plan/ Exam sub-committees of Faculties/Quality Assurance. AGSM: Statutory meetings. Co-ordinators of committees /sub-committee, to present their reports to the Secretary-General.



- Quality Assurance Committee: A review of their scope of work is needed to improve their Impact on the College. Currently random Accreditation check/Monitoring of exam process.
- 10. **Medical Residency Bill**: Meetings have been held and currently a database is being compiled according to guidelines proposed by the NPMCN. Key issues on accreditation
- 11. **Chapter Activities**: 2019 saw a surge in activities in all Chapters and that is commendable especially for newer Francophone chapters and we hope to increase the momentum.

However, due to the simultaneous conduct of exams in three centers and movement of small numbers of candidates to Nigeria, with a reduction in the number of examiners, Accra is beginning to make significant profit.

2018/AGM/NOV/17 COMMUNIQUÉ

PREAMBLE

- The 43rd Annual General and Scientific Meeting of the West African College of Physicians was held at the PALAIS DE LA GRATITUDE, Abomey- Calavi, Benin republic from 3rd to 8th November 2019.
- The Minister of Health, Republic of Benin, **Prof Benjamin HOUNKPATIN**, representative of the Minister of higher education & scientific research, **Prof Raphaël DARBOUX**, representative of DG WAHO, **Prof Abdulrahman SOW** and representative of DG CAMES, **Prof Edouard NGOU-MILAMA** were in attendance.
- The Minister of Health, Republic of Benin, **Prof Benjamin HOUNKPATIN** declared the meeting open on Monday, the 4th November 2019.
- The Theme of the Conference was "Health and environment in the perspectives of the achievement of the sustainable development goals (SDG)" and the subthemes were:
 - o 'Post-Graduate Training: meeting the needs of the subregion'
 - o 'Medical Emergencies in the subregion'
- Six hundred and three (603) delegates and medical students, and over 30 guests from 13 Chapters: Benin, Burkina Faso, Cote D'Ivoire, The Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone and Togo attended the meeting. Presidents of sister Colleges, the National Post Graduate Medical College of Nigeria (NPMCN), the Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons, the Liberia College of Physicians & Surgeons, the West African College of Surgeons, the West African College of Nursing were also in attendance.
- The academic activities of the meeting included the following:
 - The Mabayoje College Lecture, titled "Human Resource for health crisis in the West African sub-region: Implications for achieving Universal health coverage" by Dr Christopher Ndukaife OBIONU on behalf of the Faculty of Community Health
 - The Annual College Symposium featuring: "Environment & Non communicable diseases" was presented by the Faculty of Internal Medicine. Topics covered included: 'Disorders of cognition in the elderly environmental and genetic interactions', 'Air Pollution and Health risk', and' Achieving quality in postgraduate education'.
 - The College training symposium on postgraduate training in the sub-region with the topics:-



- Harmonisation of curricula for postgraduate training in Francophone West Africa by Dr Abdoulaye DIALLO
- CAMES and Quality assurance in medical training: challenges and perspectives by Dr Edouard NGOU-MILAMA: The Postgraduate medical training programmes in Anglophone West Africa by Dr Roger MAKANJUOLA
- Post graduate medical training in West Africa: Perspectives and challenges by Dr Angela OKOLO

The postgraduate Medical training was evaluated and challenges faced by the trainees, trainers and institutions were discussed in details.

- There were scientific sessions in which over one hundred (100) scientific papers & posters relevant to the themes and subthemes were presented and discussed,
- Thirty eight (38) New Fellows and One hundred and Five (105) New Members in the medical specialties of Community Health, Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, Laboratory Medicine, Paediatrics & Psychiatry were inducted at the ceremony opening;
- Eight (8) New Fellows by election were also inducted at the closing ceremony.

The following Observations were made:-

- The West African Sub-region continues to face serious human resources for health crisis, made worse by political and economic challenges;
- The crisis is influenced by shortage of health professionals, brain drain, maldistribution of the available professionals, specialty imbalance, inadequate manpower development and inter professional conflicts;
- The integration of Postgraduate medical training in the subregion has made some progress in the areas of harmonisation of curricula and association of specialists, but is yet to achieve the desired mutual recognition of Postgraduate medical qualifications across the sub region;
- There is high attrition rate and low progression to fellowship of the College among residents in some chapters;
- Environmental factors including air pollution, ecosystem degradation, poor waste management and unhealthy lifestyles are important risk factors for non-communicable diseases and mental disorders in the subregion;
- The emergency response system in the sub-region is poor, resulting in unnecessary loss of life.



RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendations to Governments and other stakeholders

- Governments and other relevant stakeholders should improve resources for training & retention of healthcare professionals;
- Governments and employers should improve welfare packages and conditions of service for health workers to reduce brain drain;
- Governments should put policy in place to address maldistribution of health professionals, specialty imbalance and inter-professional conflict;
- Governments should ensure that their medical councils mutually recognise the Postgraduate medical qualifications in the subregion as harmonised by WAHO;
- Governments in the subregion should urgently put policies and measures in place to promote green economy, clean environment and health system strengthening through intersectoral collaboration;
- Governments should urgently put in place an effective and efficient emergency response system;
- Governments should create awareness on environmental pollution and mainstream environmental sustainability education into the educational curricula of schools.

Recommendations to the College

- The College should continue working with WAHO to complete the integration and harmonisation of the postgraduate training curricula in the subregion;
- The College should make strong advocacy to Governments and stakeholders on the need to address the menace of environmental pollution;
- The College should ensure that trainers and trainees are trained and certified in life support;
- The College should advocate strongly on the need to put in place an effective and efficient emergency response system;
- The College should collaborate with Governments and other stakeholders to train a critical mass of first responders.
