EXAMINATIONS: April 2021 Computer based test (CBT)

The first CBT exam in the College history was held on 4th March 2021 simultaneously in Abuja, Ibadan, Enugu and Accra in collaboration with Joint Admissions and Matriculations Board (JAMB). Lessons were learnt to improve the process for the future exams. The main suggestion is to hold Primary and Membership exams on separate days and this will be implemented for the upcoming exams.

CBT exams will be continued and extended to Membership for the Enugu center. College commends all efforts from CBT Committee chaired by Dr Akin Moses, EXCO, chief examiners, examiners, staff, JAMB officers who worked tirelessly to reach this great milestone for our College.

Clinical and Practicals exams for Membership and Fellowship were held in Abuja, Ibadan and Accra from 6^{th} to 13^{th} April 2021.

As the new normal in the COVID era, virtual platform (Zoom) was used to conduct dissertation defense for many candidates with an onsite examiner/or proctor staying with the candidate and a remote examiner, all connected to zoom. Despite network disturbances, this process went quite well allowing savings in time and resources. College will improve its capacity to conduct remote examinations smoothly and without lowering the high standards and integrity that are vital for us.

A **training of trainers (TOT)** was organized during the exams on "Developing a robust question bank" for the College. This TOT was virtual and was attended by more than

470 examiners. We thank **Dr. V. Ansa our Director of training** for this. College purchased a zoom license for each faculty. This will allow Chief Examiners to conduct regular meetings with examiners for exam preparation.

WACP FELLOWS DATABASE

A comprehensive database of all Fellows and Members has been compiled and will allow the College to have better communication and disseminate information more efficiently. We entreat Fellows to update their information with the College.

PROPOSAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

An automated system will be launched in the coming months to allow College to modernize and manage more smoothly proposals and dissertations.

WACP STRATEGIC PLAN



CONSTITUTIONAL REVIEW
